

Saturday Night Selections

- **2015 Louis Barruol Croze Hermitage Tiercerolles** \$28
Syrah
A full, rich Northern Rhone Syrah. Gun powder, black cherry, licorice. "The 2015 Tiercerolles is above and beyond anything I have previously tasted from Crozes Hermitage—and let's face it, folks, this is KLWM's 45th anniversary, so I have tasted tons of Crozes over the past 45 years. Here's the best." -Kermit Lynch

- **2014 Twenty Bench Napa Cabernet** \$20
90% Cabernet, 7% Merlot, 3% Malbec
A correct Napa Cab with a ripe black cherry core, twining with blackberry syrup, a subtle minerality, with the smokiness of charred French oak on the nose. The mouth is creamy and dense, with layered of juicy berries, the darkest of dark chocolates, rich espresso and black pepper.

- **2014 Les Demoiselles de Falfas Côtes de Bourg** \$20
75% Merlot, 25% Cabernet Sauvignon
The 2nd label from Falfas, "the girls" is produced from vines up to the tenth year, vinified separately and not barrel-aged. Up-front juicy fruit with just enough grip to keep you coming back.

- **2014 Brick House Gamay Noir** \$32
Brick House's Gamay is good year after year and this one is no exception. Bright, floral and cherry notes along with with hind of anise or licorice. Organic

- **2013 Saviah Walla Walla Malbec** \$20
From a blend of three outstanding vineyards, the wine has classic Malbec aromas and flavors of blue fruit, black fruit, savory spice, and cocoa. A big velvety mouthfeel with savory minerality and a long delicious finish.

- **2014 Gaja Ca' Marcanda Promis** \$42
55% Merlot, 35% Syrah, 10% Sangiovese
Bright and fruity aromas with a jammy nose. A delightful wine that combines the elegance and suppleness of Merlot and Syrah with the austerity of Sangiovese. Balanced and approachable in its youth with considerable aging potential. 13% alcohol by volume

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
