

SIX REDS

- **2011 Bergon Petit Verdot** (\$11)
The Bergon family have been producing wine since 1905 in the Languedoc region of South France. A bit of an odd ball varriety in this region, this Petit Verdot is beautifully elegant and expressive with a complex finish. Red berries, figs and pepper on the nose and a full mouth feel. 13% alcohol by volume. **Was \$15 now \$11**

- **2012 Stephen Vincent Merlot** (\$11)
85% Merlot, 15% Syrah
Stephen Vincent Merlot is produced from a skilled blend of Central Coast Merlot with a touch of Monterey Syrah. Bold plum and berry flavors with just the right amount of soft tannins and the right balance of toasty oak. **Was \$15 now \$11**

- **2009 Ismael Arroyo Ribera del Dureo "Mesoneros"** (\$14)
Tempranillo
From Ribero del Duero, this big Tempranillo has had time to soften up. Its smoothness will make your taste buds think they've been put to bed with silk sheets. Oak aged in chalk tunnels hundreds of feet underground. Full, dark and rich. **Was \$20 now \$14**

- **2010 Clos des Saumanes Cotes du Rhone** (\$11)
55% Grenache, 25% Syrah, 20% Cinsault
An out performer. The Saumanes has "nice floral notes, mint and lavender, which leave shades of strawberry, pepper and chili with aeration. This medium-bodied 2010 has large fruit, a remarkable acidity and an impeccable finish." ~ Parker

- **2009 Château Bellegrave Medoc** (\$11)
40% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Franc, 10% Petit Verdot
With flavors of wood aging as well as sweet tannins, this is a concentrated and richly fruity wine. It has the ripe fruit of 2009, sweet berries, the tannins cushioned within the softness. A great value.
13% alcohol by volume

- **2013 Mas Olivier Faugères** (\$14)
41% Syrah, 18% Grenache, 18% Cinsault, 13% Carignan, 10% Mourvèdre
After breathing, it reveals a sumptuous nose of red cherries and plum fruits. The mouth is structured and dense with delicate notes of black berries and violets. It has a persistent finish on mellow tannins.

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SIX WHITES

- **2012 Corte Giacobbe Pinot Griggio** (\$11)
Captivating nose of fruits & flowers (especially pear & banana). Well-balanced salty-sour notes on the palate, with a long persistence. 12.5% alcohol by volume. **Was \$14 now \$11**

- **2014 Domaine de la Fruitiere** (\$12)
Chardonnay
Not a Burgundy, the Fruitiere is 100% Chardonnay from granite, mica, and clay soils in Muscadet. The wine is aged in stainless steel tanks for 8 months before release. It is rich and crisp at the same time, with an underlying mineral backbone. 12% alcohol by volume

- **2013 Les Pentes de Barène Tursan** (\$15)
35% Barougue, 30% Gros Manseng, 20% Sauvignon Blanc, 15% Petit Manseng
From the Southwest of France comes this bold full white. The Pentes de Barène casts aromas of grapefruit, passion fruit, wildflowers and smoky minerals. Crisp and zesty on the palate, with suggestions of grapefruit, guava and chalky minerals, impressive energy and tactile grip. Pairs with chicken and lighter roasted meats as well as roasted vegetables.

- **2014 Castelvero, Cortese** (\$10)
The Castelvero estate is located near Monferrato. As the vines are not located in Gavi, the wine just goes by the name of the grape. It is an attractively herbaceous and clean white with aromas of grapefruit and minerals, with a light-body, and fresh, crisp citrus fruit. 11.5% alcohol by volume

- **2014 Domaine de Coujan Cépage Rolle** (\$11)
Vin de Pays Coteau de Murviel
The new vintage of this 100% Rolle (vermentino) from southern France. Nice full fruit with notes of melon and citrus. 13% alcohol by volume NEW VINTAGE

- **2013 Latour Macon-Villages Chameroy** (\$15)
Chardonnay
The Chameroy has a fresh, creamy bouquet of white fruits and almond and a great roundness and a lot of elegance on the palate. A good forward everyday Burgundy. 13% alcohol by volume

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SIX MORE REDS

- ☐ **2009 Frei Joao Bairrada Reserva** (\$16)
35% Baga, 45% Torriga Nacional, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon
A rich red and black fruited nose and palate sports a classic Cabernet cassis-fuelled attack and (long) finish of great purity. Plum and briar fruit fleshes out the juicy mid-palate. An elegant, fruit-driven red with fine-grained tannins and lovely freshness.
- ☐ **2010 Bovio Dabbene** (\$15)
Dolcetto
A single vineyard Dolcetto of hand-picked old vines. The bouquet is delicate, but well-defined: dark cherries, hints of spice and a potpourri of flowers. On the palate, mouth feel is round with mid-body weight and broad notes of sour cherries, spices, slightly almond, well-balanced. **Was \$20 now \$15**
- ☐ **2012 Stephen Vincent Crimson Red** (\$11)
60% Syrah, 25% Petit Syrah, 15% Cabernet Sauvignon
Crimson is produced from a blend of grapes from the Monterey County and North Coast growing regions of California. This wine has lots of black fruit on the nose. Soft tannins round out the beautiful ripe plum and blackberry flavor, accented with hints of cassis and toasty oak. **Was \$15 now \$11**
- ☐ **2011 Lamartine Cahors** (\$14)
90% Malbec, 10% Merlot
"There's a ripe plushness to the dried blackberry, fig and tobacco flavors that lengthen out on the spice-infused midpalate. Baker's chocolate, cream and vanilla notes power the finish. Malbec and Merlot." Wine Spectator
The wine has softened up nicely and adjusted its price. **Was \$25 now \$14**
- ☐ **2010 Trelat Saint-Amour** (\$12)
Gamay
Named after a Roman centurion rather than a god of love, Saint-Amour produces structured Beaujolais. This one has softened up nicely with a bit of age on it. Nice Raspberry and cherry fruit with a nice slatey mineral finish. **Was \$24 now \$12**
- ☐ **2011 Quenard Chignin** (\$15)
Mondeuse
A floral light red from the Savoie, lots of raspberry fruit flavor with hints of smoke and chocolate. An underappreciated classic red. **Was \$30 now \$15**

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
