

- **2014 Usseglio Châteauneuf du Pape Cuvee Girard** \$30  
90% Grenache, 4% Mourvèdre, 4% Syrah, 2% Cinsault, 2% Counoise  
From 80-year-old vines. Cuvée Girard is a custom blend for importer Peter Weygandt. Showing a touch darker fruit and possibly more concentration, it has building tannin and a solid finish. It has outstanding potential. Biodynamic. **Was \$43, now \$30**
  
- **2011 Chantegrive Graves** \$25  
50% Merlot, 50% Cabernet Sauvignon  
A pleasing and complex bouquet of toasted bread and ripe black fruits and gunpowder. The attack is full-bodied with dry silky tannins. There is a good balance here between the ripe blackberry fruits and the solid tannins. This wine shows new wood and a touch of green flavor. 13% alcohol by volume
  
- **2014 Andeluna Altitude Malbec** \$30  
From vineyards 1300 meters high, the Altitude Malbec spends 12 months in barrel to develop the balance between the fruit and the tannins. The wine offers a deeply spiced aroma, with richly concentrated flavors of dark chocolate, mocha and roasted plum, showing some serious tannins. Asian spice and black pepper accents emerge on the dense finish.
  
- **2013 Santa Lucia A'Luciano, Morellino di Scansano** \$12  
90% Sangiovese, 10% Alicante  
Pretty aromas of blue flower and forest floor take center stage in this straightforward blend of 90% Sangiovese and 10% Alicante. The fresh, juicy palate is dominated by wild cherry, while black pepper notes add interest. 13% alcohol by volume **Was \$15 now \$12**
  
- **2014 Albert Bichot Bourgogne Vieilles Vignes** \$15  
Pinot Noir  
A dry, medium-bodied Pinot that aromas of rose petals and raspberries. A bit of air is required to have it open up. 12.5% alcohol by volume. **Was \$20 now \$15**
  
- **2014 Domaine Vetriccie Ile de Beauté Rouge** \$10  
40% Niellucciu, 30% Sciaccarellu, 20% Merlot, 10% Syrah  
A lighter Corsican Red with Mediterranean spice notes as well licorice and black currants. 12% alcohol by volume
